ARTIST STATEMENT

Meandering explores an imagined landscape that holds a subtle portrayal of a figure. An extension of the artist's *Undergrowth Series* with explorations rooted in early observations of visual similarities between the human body and elements of nature (e.g. ears may look like caves, veins may look like roots, rainfall like tears, hair like grass or moles like pebbles), the composition of a natural landscape as a portrayal of one's internal being is a nod to man's inherent closeness to nature. Named after a type of river, *Meandering* is a self portrait of sorts which poses that perhaps knowing oneself is non-linear and though not endless, it is a continuous and dynamic discovery filled with constant change and development despite being aimless or with seemingly little purpose at times. Forms in the distance suggest that this is merely one part of the wilderness within us as it is not a homogeneous ecosystem. Familiar yet ambiguous, it reflects the complexities of self, flowing, multi-layered and ever-evolving.

ARTIST STATEMENT

Beneath Burrows conceals an over-the-shoulder silhouette of two figures within an imagined landscape that interprets perpetual shifts in one's psyche. An extension of the artist's *Undergrowth Series* with explorations rooted in early observations of visual similarities between the human body and elements of nature (e.g. ears may look like caves, veins may look like roots, rainfall like tears, hair like grass or moles like pebbles), the composition of a natural landscape as a portrayal of one's internal being is a nod to man's inherent closeness to nature. Embodied in the artist's intuitive process, the work takes shape in undulating forms which unfold organically. Obscure and nondescript, *Beneath Burrows* alludes to the fact that there is more than meets the eye and that there will always be room for discovery within an individual as figures are hidden in plain sight yet may not necessarily be noticeable, and the complexity of self continually pulsates beneath the surface.

ABOUT THE ARTIST



John Marie Andrada (b. 2001, Philippines/ Singapore) is a multidisciplinary artist whose work spans painting, installation, sculpture, photography and video. Growing up and taking root in a once foreign country, she moves between mediums and draws from personal recounts to reflect on the complexities of identity, time and the human experience. Defined by an ongoing investigation of how narrative and visual language can intertwine, her practice blends figuration and abstraction, driven by an intuitive, experimental approach to image-making.

Andrada graduated with a BA in Fine Arts (First Class Honors) from LASALLE College of the Arts in partnership with Goldsmiths, University of London in 2023. In 2024, she debuted her first Solo with Haridas Contemporary, Singapore. She was a recipient of The Winston Oh Travelogue Award (2023) and exhibited in DECK's Undescribed #9 helmed by John Tung and Robert Zhao. Her works have been nominated for International Takifuji Art Award, Japan (2022), featured in Project 3V (Visualize, Voice and Vision) at FassArt Gallery, Istanbul (2021), 9th Dali International Photography Exhibition (DIPE), China (2021), and received the Special Choice Award for the 41st Daegu International Grand Exhibition, Korea (2022).
